## **Excellence. Engagement. Equity.**

### Parents & Carers,

As many of you can attest, it is hard to believe that we have already completed 4 weeks of Term 2, and it certainly feels like a mountain of achievements, events and student learning has occurred in this short time. This term, we have supported 4 new students as they commenced their education at St. Dominic's this term and have also welcomed almost 20 families into our school for tours, as they consider enrolment in 2024-2028.

Term 2 started 'with a bang' and we have not stopped!! Our staff have recently been engaged in professional learning for the introduction and implementation of MACS *Vision for Instruction*: Flourishing Learners. Whilst all 300 MACS (Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools) are in these initial stages and there is much deepened learning and implementation to follow, it is part of the greater vision of the MACS 2030 Strategic Plan, with the long term goal of Excellence & Equity. This ensures the highest standard of teaching and learning, for all students, all of the time. The MACS *Vision for Instruction* position statement is a crucial document which will support all MACS schools to deliver high-quality learning and teaching for all students. Over the coming months as the roll out continues & our staff are further immersed in learning and classroom implementation, we will share success stories of our students in their learning and engagement.

Recently, we partnered with Catholic Mission, whose motto is, Reach Out. Give Life. We were honoured to have been invited to be the 'pilot school' for their newly-developed schools program, MAP- Mission Ambassador Program. Recently our Year 6 students took part in this very first student engagement session, which was equally reflective, personally & cognitively challenging and deeply connected to the principles of Catholic Social Teaching, lived by each of us in our world. Our staff also took part in an immersion session on the same afternoon. We now look forward to furthering this great connection, empowering our senior students to teach others and make authentic connections with other schools and communities.

Our Year 5/6 students have been busy with preparations for Kangaroobie Camp this week, and we will share all of their exciting Camp news in our next newsletter. Our Year 6 students participated in workshop 2 of the UPP-Unleashing Personal Potential Leadership program. Each of these students is a superstar and we are all so proud of every student, for the responsibilities they embrace each day and for being wonderful role models to all students. Our Year 5s have also had some opportunities to 'step up' in leadership, with some recent school tours and our flag raising & ANZAC Day assembly whilst our Year 6s have been 'otherwise engaged' in their roles & workshops. Also, our Year 5/6s prepared and celebrated our very first St. Dom's Level Mass last week.

STEM & Science is certainly embedded in the learning for all students each week and our newly setup learning space is loved by all. We look forward to further resourcing this space and ensuring that all students have access to and are immersed in contemporary resources which challenge, inspire innovation & creativity, and encourage critical thinking and problem solving skills for all. Watch this space!

The loan of Aboriginal Stations of the Cross has been a blessing for our students and community. Aboriginal Catholic Ministry loans these magnificent art pieces to parishes and we were fortunate to be able to accept the offer of display here at St. Dom's. Veritas Hall has been where all staff and students have visited, to view, inquire, be inspired, compare & contrast the artistic interpretations of the events of Jesus' final hours. I hope you too had some time to visit.

Our staff are in preparation for our 2024 School Review, which is a 4-year, cyclical review, evaluating Compliance & School Improvement & engaging all community stakeholders in its process, with the outcome of prioritising key areas of school improvement for the next 4 years at St. Dominics. Over the coming months, I will keep you informed and updated.

In these 'post-Festa-months', as we continue to beam with pride about the success of this *magnifico* community event and invite our community to suggest ways to best utilise the profits for our students, we also turn our focus to the centenary of St. Dominic's School, in 2025. In next week's newsletter, we will be outlining some of the preliminary works already happening, as well as map out plans ahead and invite you to be part of the festivities!



## **LEARNING & TEACHING IN TERM 2**

Learning is well under way for the term with rooms full of engaged learners who are loving the challenges presented to them across the curriculum. To align with our IBL focus on Innovation and Discovery, the whole school will attend the da Vinci experience at the LUME on Tuesday 21st May. An

Operoo communication will be sent out soon. In Writing, students are learning to create information reports and procedures. These link so authentically to our IBL and Science and provide meaningful opportunities for students to write about topics of interest. In Mathematics, students are finishing their learning in the Number domain and will soon begin learning about shapes and transformations. Literature Circles have commenced in the 3/4 classes, with students learning about the roles while reading fun and



engaging books. Our Year 4 students have also begun preparing for the Sacrament of Holy Communion on Sunday 26th May. Teachers are also in the early stages of writing Semester One reports. Over the coming weeks, data will be collected through a range of strategies, including work samples, rich tasks, assessments and student feedback to ensure an accurate report is created for all students.

## This Week is Composting Awareness Week!

Composting organic residuals and creating compost is a proven winning combination to tackle climate change, while also helping to keep soils healthy. It also helps to make soil more resilient to drought, reduce the need for mineral fertilisers, support biodiversity and grow more nutrient-rich foods.

As the world grapples with the urgent need to combat climate change, International Compost Awareness Week (ICAW) stands as a beacon of hope, celebrating compost and the importance of organics recycling. From 5th to 11th May, individuals, communities, and organisations

worldwide will unite to raise awareness about the transformative power of compost and composting in mitigating climate change.

This year's theme, **COMPOST... Nature's Climate Champion**, highlights the very real fact that we can still fight climate change instead of accepting it as given. Through organics recycling and the return of compost back to our soils, greenhouse gas emissions can be reduced with additional benefits being delivered including improved soil health and biodiversity, increased agricultural productivity, enhanced food security and water quality.
