Community of Kindness

Parents & Carers,



Tomorrow, we celebrate our St. Dominic's Grandparents & Special Friends' Day. We will gather together in prayer and celebration in St. Dominic's church at 9.15am, then our special visitors will enjoy Morning Tea and listen to our school Choir in Veritas Hall. They will then visit classrooms, and gather once again for our 11am Remembrance Day Service. This day is a special occasion for our most significant people in the lives of our students & families.

The month of November is often known for 'Movember' – when many men across Australia grow moustaches to raise awareness around men's health issues, including men's mental health. The month of November is also about kindness and compassion – with World Kindness Day on 13th November and World Compassion Day on the 28th. While no-one would argue against the importance of kindness and compassion, their role in the workplace (and in our community and the broader society) may be seen as a 'nice to have' rather than a 'must have'. Yet evidence suggests otherwise.

What is compassion? It's defined as empathy plus action. Empathy is the ability to sense and understand others' feelings. If we then add insightful and responsive action where our motivation is to assist – an authentic desire to help - then that creates compassion.

In a recent article in the Harvard Business Review, the authors discuss the vital roles of kindness and compassion:

- Showing more compassion is associated with less likelihood of burnout. In other words, compassion can have beneficial effects not only for the receiver of compassion, but also for the giver. For those who are compassionate it can lead to a longer life by reducing risk of cardiovascular disease. It can help maintain cognitive function and contribute to our overall levels of happiness and sense of wellbeing.
- Those who are generous and agreeable are more likely to be promoted. Leaders who are primarily focused on the wellbeing of their employees have employees with greater reported job satisfaction and greater trust in the organisation, which leads to improved retention. It also has been linked with improved employee job performance and better team performance.

Maybe above all, being kind and compassionate simply feels good. It opens us to the world and to other people. It connects us to each other and expands our sense of who we are. And it's important we don't forget kindness and compassion towards ourselves and our vulnerabilities.

So in November, as we think about world compassion and kindness days, take a gentle breath in, and as you breathe out, nurture a sense of gentle kindness towards yourself and those around you. Our world needs it.



Our Beloved Dominican Saints

On November 7th, our Dominican family celebrates the feast of all Dominican Saints. That's one week after the Catholic Church celebrates All Saints Day (1 November), where we honour all the saints, whether they are known or unknown.

The image below is a contemporary illustration of holy men and women from the Dominican family gathered around the Blessed Virgin Mary. The artist, Bernadette Carstensen, wanted to pay homage to the Order's life and mission from every century, different countries, nobility, and poverty.

The blue of the sky is symbolic of Mary's veil enveloping her beloved Dominicans; this is also the reason her head is uncovered. It is meant as a reference to St. Dominic's heavenly vision of the Order sheltered beneath the Blessed Mother's mantle.




