## Kindness Matters....


Parents & Carers,

Many of you will have read the book and/or watched the film 'Wonder'. If so, you will know it as a heartwarming, thought-provoking and uplifting story of acceptance, diversity, inclusion and kindness. As we work together in partnership in the care, wellbeing and education of your children, I invite you to seek out this story of 'Wonder' which enhances the kindness culture of families, our school, our community and our world.

Our recent Harmony Day celebrations acknowledge the diversity and blessings of our own community, and the social message that kindness really does matter. As we nurture the adults of the future, we know that kindness, tolerance, acceptance and care are the life skills our world needs more than ever. Through the Resilience Project and Respectful Relationships, the message is consistent and prepares our 2022 students to be pro-social and positive citizens of our future. What a gift that is!

I share with you the excerpt of an article by Steven Siegle, Behavioural Health Counselor, who writes of Kindness and the benefits for each of us, both adults and children alike.

*Kindness is more than behavior. The art of kindness means harboring a spirit of helpfulness, as well as being generous and considerate, and doing so without expecting anything in return. Kindness is a quality of being. The act of giving kindness often is simple, free, positive and healthy.*



### Good for the body

Kindness has been shown to increase self-esteem, empathy and compassion, and improve mood. It can decrease blood pressure and cortisol, a stress hormone, which directly impacts stress levels. People who give of themselves in a balanced way also tend to be healthier and live longer. Kindness can increase your sense of connectivity with others, which can directly impact loneliness, improve low mood and enhance relationships in general. It also can be contagious. Looking for ways to show kindness can give you a focus activity, especially if you tend to be anxious or stressed in some social situations.

### Good for the mind

Physiologically, kindness can positively change your brain. Being kind boosts serotonin and dopamine, which are neurotransmitters in the brain that give you feelings of satisfaction and well-being, and cause the pleasure/reward centers in your brain to light up. Endorphins, which are your body's natural pain killer, also can be released.



### Be kind to yourself

It is not just how you treat other people — it is how you extend those same behaviors and intentions to yourself as well. I believe you can be kinder in your own self-talk and practice gratitude. Negativity often causes you to unravel and may even create a vicious cycle of regularly getting down on yourself. You wouldn't talk to your neighbor the way you sometimes talk to yourself. This is what I call the "good neighbor policy," which can be helpful. If you would not say it to your good neighbor, do not say it about yourself.

### Take action

Simply asking "How am I going to practice kindness today?" can be helpful. A positive focus is like planting positive seeds in your mind garden. Where focus goes, energy flows.

Finally, I'd like to leave you with this quote: "Be kind whenever possible. It is always possible." —Dalai Lama



# Learning & Teaching News

## APSMO

This week, our Year 5/6 students and some 3/4 students participated in the APSMO Games and Olympiad. APSMO is the Australasian Problems Solving Mathematics Organisation contest that promotes a very high level of critical thinking, problem solving and reasoning skills in Mathematics. The APSMO Games take place 5 times a year and require students to solve 5 (somewhat challenging tasks) within a 30 minute time frame. Some of our brave Maths superstars tackled the Olympiad, which involved even more challenging problem solving questions. Here is a taste of some of the questions.....

### *Senior Olympiad*

*A bookshelf holds 6 different textbooks, 5 different notebooks, and 23 different cookbooks. How many different pairs of books can I select from the shelf, if the two books must be of different types?*

### *Junior Olympiad*

*There are 6 cups, equally spaced, arranged in a circle in some order. Each cup has a different colour: red, orange, yellow, green, blue and purple. The blue cup is not next to the green cup. The purple cup is next to the yellow cup. The red cup is next to the green and purple cups. Which cup is directly across from the orange cup?*

### *Junior Games*

*Peter made marmalade sandwiches and vegemite sandwiches. He made 8 more marmalade sandwiches than vegemite sandwiches. He made 30 sandwiches in total. How many marmalade sandwiches did Peter make?*

While our students found some of the questions challenging, there is a lot of learning to take away. Contests of these kind, build resilience, determination and persistence and draw on a range of metacognition. We congratulate the students for their efforts yesterday and we look forward to participating in the next APSMO contest in May.

## Naplan

Today our Year 5 students participated in the Naplan Coordinated Practise Test. This provided them with the opportunity to become familiar with the Naplan online platform - the site they will use for the upcoming Naplan tests in May. Next week, both the Year 3 and 5 students will participate in more practice tests using the platform as well as practicing Naplan questions from all test domains, including Reading, Mathematics and Language Conventions. This year is the first time both year levels will experience Naplan testing, as the Year 5 students did not participate in 2020 due to working remotely. It is important for the students to be familiar with the online platform and types of questions they might encounter in the tests so that when they participate in the actual tests, they feel comfortable and confident with the process. **Naplan testing will take place on Tuesday 9 May, Wednesday 10 May and Thursday 11 May.** More information will be communicated closer to the testing days.

## \*COVID UPDATES & REMINDERS\*

Parents/Carers,

In order for St. Dominic's School to ensure all risk assessment and necessary safety measures are adhered to, we ask that all staff, families and students operate in accordance with COVID Safe measures. Thank you to all families who are working to support the Covid Safe measures we have in place. I thank our Staff and Families for the partnership and communication which has supported those impacted, and in ensuring students return to school safely.

Our school is responsible for ensuring the safety of our community, and all COVID Safe measures are in accordance with current health directives and advice from MACS (Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools). The Catholic Education Commission of Victoria works closely with the Victorian Department of Education and Training (DET) and Victorian Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), to ensure school practices reflect current advice and support the needs of their school communities.

*We are now permitted to have visitors and volunteers in our school, however they must adhere to COVID Safe requirements – this strictly includes: vaccination, physical distancing, face mask requirements, cough etiquette, and good hand hygiene.*

*For the remainder of Term 1, parents/carers (one per child only) may bring their child into the classroom (or drop at their classroom door) between 8.45-9.00am ONLY.*

*As these are brief visits, Vaccination status will not be required, however will be required for future events or long term stays and support at the school. This will be communicated when relevant. All other safety measures above are in place and we thank you in advance for your cooperation.*

*We look forward to welcoming you into your child's learning space, though for limited times at this stage.*

*Over the coming weeks, we will advise you of opportunities to invite parents into classrooms as parent helpers, keeping in line with the Covid Safe requirements above. We anticipate starting this in Week 10, then commence more regularly in Term 2.*

*As communities in partnership in the education and care of your children, we look forward to re-engaging our families in as many ways as possible and as safely as possible.*

#### School events

- School community events are permitted (keeping in accordance with all Covid Safe measures), with organisers applying a risk assessment and implementing required risk mitigation measures.

#### Face masks

- Staff are required to always wear masks indoors (exemption if primary school staff are actively teaching)
- Masks are not compulsory for teachers and staff outdoors.
- Students in Years 3 to 6 must wear a face mask indoors, including age equivalent children

#### Rapid antigen testing

- Free rapid antigen tests are made available for all staff and students throughout Term 1 2022.

#### If: Staff/student has contracted COVID-19, completed their 7- day isolation period and is asymptomatic

- Staff/ students can safely return to school.
- They do not need to be tested if they have been re-exposed within 30 days of ending their self isolation.
- The school should confirm that the staff/student has completed their 7-day isolation period.

#### If: Staff/student with a positive RAT who receives a negative PCR test within 48 hrs after the positive RAT

- Staff/student can end their self-isolation period.
- They can safely return to school.
- Recommend that they notify the school of negative PCR test result.
- If staff/students are too unwell to attend school, usual leave/absence policies apply.

#### Required vaccinations for school staff

- COVID-19 vaccination is mandatory for staff who work in schools.
- All staff have received three doses of a COVID-19 vaccine unless a medical exemption applies.

#### Other visitors to schools (not performing work)

- QR code check-in is not required at schools. Routine school visitor record keeping arrangements continue.
- Parents, carers and other adult visitors who enter school buildings must be able to show evidence of two doses of COVID-19 vaccine or have a valid medical exemption.

\*The following limited exceptions also apply:

- when attending to administer medical treatment to their own child when the treatment cannot be administered by the school
- when attending to collect their child who is unwell and cannot leave the school building unaccompanied by their parent/carer
- when attending for a momentary period that does not involve any sustained contact with staff or students, for example, to collect a completed art project, collecting a packet of rapid antigen test or similar.
- Proof of vaccination can be checked by a COVID-19 digital certificate (Service Victoria app or smartphone wallet) or printed copy of a digital certificate or immunisation history statement.

Please ensure children are signed in no later than 9am.



What to wear

During Autumn, the mornings can be chilly, so please make sure you bring a warm top (clearly labelled) and keep an eye on the weather so your child is dressed appropriately. Some of our venues are particularly large and take time to warm up on the chillier mornings, so make sure the kids are rugged up. At TeamKids we love to get outside, so please remember to wear suitable footwear for running around.



Booking and cancellations

Bookings are subject to availability and may be placed/amended until 6.30am the day of attendance via your TeamKids online account. An additional fee of \$5 per child applies to bookings made inside 7 days of attending. Cancellations must be received 48hrs prior to attendance. If inside this time frame, full fee will be charged. Please refer to our website and your fully booked account for full cancellation T&Cs.



Double check TeamKids Room Location

It is very important to double check our website prior to attending, in case of a room change. We are sometimes required to temporarily change rooms due to school building maintenance over the school holidays. Last minute changes will be announced via SMS to attending families.

All TeamKids venues require electronic sign in/out. Any person signing your child in or out from TeamKids care MUST be listed on your TeamKids account and know your TeamKids account pin number, if this has been activated. These details can be updated via your TeamKids account at any time.



Medical Information? Have a Plan

If your child has Asthma, Anaphylaxis, an Allergy or any other medical condition, upload plans to your TeamKids account and bring along a completed Risk Minimisation Form, found on our website. Please provide required medications to your venue coordinator on the first day of attendance - In their original packaging, clearly labelled with your child's name and a use-by date.
